To access the payment, claims must be received by Friday June 28. You simply need your child's WA Student Number (found on reports and NAPLAN reports) and apply through the ServiceWA app. A paper form is available, however this must be posted AND received before the June 28 deadline.

Tomorrow, Friday June 7th, we will participate in Ahlia's Kindness Day.

Ahlia had just turned seven when her she complained about not being able to see the board at school. After a series of assessments, her parents received the news that no parent wants to hear—your daughter has a brain tumour, there is no treatments and the only thing you can do is go home and make memories.

The brain tumour that Ahlia had is called DIPG, which forms within the brain's control centre. There are no treatments and patients typically only survive a matter of months after diagnosis. Ahlia passed away less than six months after her diagnosis.

Ahlia was thoughtful, funny, kind and caring. She was destined to have a positive impact on this world. To honour her memory, her parents, her school and her friends set about creating a day to celebrate Ahlia and to raise money for research, so that one day families are no longer told to make memories, but are told that there are treatments and, ideally, there is a cure.

Ahlia's Kindness Day raises money for RUN DIPG, an Australian charity that is dedicated to improving the outcomes for patients, families and communities impacted by this deadliest form of childhood cancer. Professor Matt Dun, founding director of the charity, was already a leading cancer researcher, primarily for blood cancers, when he received the devastating diagnosis that his two year old daughter had DIPG. From this moment, his research focus pivoted and he is now dedicating his career solely to developing treatments for this currently incurable disease.

By wearing blue, and bringing a gold coin donation, we can help support Professor Dun's vital work to find effective treatments for children diagnosed with DIPG.

Together, we can make a difference.


